Harriet Tubman who was born in Maryland is one of America's most courageous heroes. Her owner tried to sell her, but there were no buyers. Consequently, she was instead put to work with her father who taught her how to lumber. She learned the secret communications about trade route from free black sailors who came to her workplace. In 1844, she married with a free black man, and then her name became from Minty to Harriet Tubman. She followed North star to Pennsylvania to freedom. She earned the nickname Black Moses and she became the first woman in United State history to plan and lead military raid in 1863. Also, she raised funds to help to build school and hospital. Araminta Ross was born in 1820s as a 5th children of slave family. She got injured and it caused sleeping spells when she was hired by neighborshop. After that, she learned about secret communication from free black people by working with her father. She married and change her name to Harriet. When her owner died, she decided to be free. She helped her family and others by traveling 13 times to south. She worked hard and she became a first woman to lead military to make 700 slaves in South Carolina free. After that, government decide to abolish slaving. She fought for women's voting rights and try to increase the fund and help black people to have their own school on

Summary (write 6-10 sentences):

Harriet Tubman was born in early 1820s, in Maryland as a chattel slavery. The injury which she got by being hit by her owner caused her a disease what we call today "narcolepsy" and it belonged to her for the rest of her life. After the death of her owner in 1849, she returned to Southern area to release a lot of people including her family and worked hard help enslaved people escape. After having worked as the first woman in the U.S. history to plan and lead a military raid, she became more active to get a woman's right to vote and she finally got it. Because of her fame and her distinguished accomplishments, image would appear on a redesigned 20 dollar bill, announced by The U.S Treasury in 2016.
